The exact causes of pancreatic cancer are unknown but some factors can **increase your risk**



People with at least two first-degree relatives* diagnosed with pancreatic cancer have almost double the risk

*Mother, father, brother or sister



Other diseases that are associated with an increased risk:

- Chronic Pancreatitis
- Periodontal Disease
- Crohn's Disease
- Previous cancers

Obesity increases the risk in approximately 12% of all pancreatic cancers.



People with diabetes have double the risk of developing pancreatic cancer.



It is estimated that smoking causes 22% of pancreatic cancers in the UK.
